In the September 2020 training it was announced that **ALL Volunteers** require CASE training, since that time we have provided exemptions:

Excluded from CASE requirements:

- Money Counters
- Committee/Council Members (as long as no minors are council/committee members, if minors attend meetings all members must be trained)
- City East Transportation
- Committees that set up and tear down for events...no contact with children
- Committees that prepare food (no serving of food, no contact with children)
- Adult Social Groups (Rosary Society, Men's/Women's Clubs) that do not have any interaction with Youth or Vulnerable adults

Other Social Groups:

- Adult Social Groups (Defined as groups of adults meeting socially where children/vulnerable adults are not present, and the group is not involved in ministry/fundraising activities with youth/vulnerable.
 - Stitching Ministry
 - Senior Ministry
 - Men's Spirituality
 - Men's/Women's Clubs
 - Women's Group (Rosary, knitting groups, etc. that meet only with each other to pray/knit)

Requires CASE:

- Eucharistic Ministers
- Ushers
- Cantors
- Lectors
- Choir Members (only if there are youth members)
- Senior Deacons: maintained by Ed Giblin
- Senior Priests: maintained by Jan Boyea
- Visiting Priests: Letter of Suitability provided to Fr. Condon from home Diocese

Only Leaders require CASE (similar to Scouts):

- Knights of Columbus
- Scouting America Leaders: for Troops/Packs/Crews meeting on parish property but not Chartered by the parish/school
- Girl Scout Leaders

Special Cases

- CYO Concession Stand requires at least one CASE trained adult to be present.
- Events that include a large number of volunteers require that all volunteers are recorded per day of the event and that at least two CASE trained adults are always present and identified. If volunteers are in direct contact with children, then they need to be CASE trained.
